OUR *CONFIDENTIAL* SERVICES INCLUDES:

CRISIS INTERVENTION

Trained volunteers and staff are on call 24 hours a day, 7 days a week to assist victims of crime.

CRISIS COUNSELING

Emotional support and guidance provided through advocacy based counseling and in some areas, professional therapy.

SUPPORT GROUPS

There are support groups available in some areas.

THERAPY

Some CVSCs will provide professional therapy for crime victims.

MEDICAL & LEGAL ADVOCACY

If a victim of crime so desires, an advocate will accompany the victim to the hospital, or other health care facility, and/or to the legal proceedings related to the crime

COST

There are no charges for the crisis intervention and advocacy services provided by the Crime Victims Service Centers.

*** Each Service Center is victim centered, available to provide services to victims whether or not they report the crime to law enforcement or their case is prosecuted. Each program will provide accessible and appropriate services to victims of general crimes.
