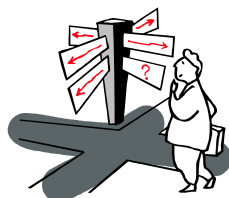

YOU HAVE RIGHTS!

Right to Safety

You have a right to be safe. In addition to safety planning, there are different types of tribal and state court orders that may be able to help you.

Right to Privacy

You have a right to privacy. There are also legal protections for certain records containing your information.

Right to Confidentiality

You have a right to confidentiality when seeking services at a rape crisis center.

Right to Financial Help

You may be able to obtain financial assistance for expenses related to the sexual assault.
